## **Den Leader 101 —Tiger, Wolf/Bear, and Webelos Den Leader**

*All NEW Cub Scout leaders serving in any position must take this introductory session before learning about the specific role they are serving. Training for all Tiger, Wolf, Bear, and Webelos Den Leaders.*

## **Cubmaster — 101**

*All NEW Cub Scout leaders serving in any position must take this introductory session before learning about the specific role they are serving. Training for all Cubmasters.*

## **Cub Committee 101**

*Learn about the backbone of every strong Pack! Program planning, record keeping and advancement basics for pack committee members. How to set your pack up for success and keep things running smoothly!*

## **Chartered Organization Representative 101**

*This is required training for the Chartered Organizational Representative (COR) of each Pack. The COR's primary responsibilities are to help units to be successful and to provide coordination between the chartered organization and Scouting. Encourage your COR to attend Pow Wow and come to this training.*

## **What is STEM?**

*This new NOVA awards program incorporates learning with cool activities and exposure to science, technology, engineering and mathematics. Learn how to become a SuperNOVA mentor and help the little fishes in your Pack earn their SuperNOVA Awards. We will then dive into the topic and you will learn all about the program and take the first steps to becoming a certified SuperNOVA.*

## **Whittling Chip**

*Cub Scouts are encouraged to learn safety rules and the proper use of a pocketknife. Cub Scouts and Webelos Scouts may earn the right to carry a pocketknife to designated Scouting functions by completing requirements for the Whittling Chip card. This course provides instructors a firm foundation in how to teach the boys these important concepts and skills. Bring a knife for hands-on instruction!*

## **Academics and Sports Program**

*The Cub Scout Academics and Sports program complements the scouting program by providing opportunities for scouts to improve scholarship, develop sportsmanship, and explore new games while collecting Cub Scout belt loops and pins. The emphasis of the program is to try new things and to put forth a best effort, not of achieving proficiency or winning. This program is one method of addressing the third aim of Scouting: the development of physical, mental, and emotional fitness. Fitness includes the body (well-tuned and healthy), the mind (able to think and solve problems), and the emotions (self-control, courage, and self-respect).*

## **Ceremonies**

*Use simple ceremonies to open and close den meetings and to mark important events in the lives of the boys and the den. Den ceremonies should be short—no longer than two or three minutes—and varied. The same opening and closing each week will become boring. Occasionally, the boys should have a chance to help plan and lead den ceremonies.*

## **Journey to Excellence**

*“Scouting’s Journey to Excellence” is the BSA’s new council performance recognition program designed to encourage and reward success and measure the performance of our units, districts, and councils. It is replacing the Centennial Quality Awards Program as a means of encouraging excellence in providing a quality program at all levels of the BSA. Even this late in the year, it is possible to achieve bronze, silver, or gold excellence levels. Learn how.*

### **BALOO: Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (Cost \$15.00 This is an all day course)**

*Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO) training is for any Cub Scout leader with a desire to plan and carry out any outdoor experience for the pack. Completing this training will help develop an increased level of confidence and a willingness to plan an age-appropriate pack overnigher. BALOO is fun and learning that prepares pack leaders to plan and carry out “entry-level” outdoor experiences. Ask a boy why he wants to be a Cub Scout, and nine times out of 10 he’ll answer “to go camping.” That’s why Cub Scouting has introduced BALOO training, so boys, along with their parents or some other adult, can participate in a successful overnight camping experience. Preparing lunch is part of this all-day course.*

## Den Chief Training (*Den Chief Handbook included in course cost of \$20.00.*)

The Den Chief is an older Boy Scout, Varsity Scout, or Venturer who works with a Cub Scout or Webelos den. He is selected by the Scoutmaster, Coach, or Advisor in cooperation with the Cubmaster. He may be of any age or rank, but he can be the greatest help if he is a former Cub Scout and if he is mature enough to assume this important responsibility. As a selected leader of younger boys, he has the opportunity to help them complete their Cub Scout or Webelos Scout advancement requirements and live up to Cub Scouting's ideals in their everyday lives. The Den Chief is a member of a leadership team which also includes the den leader, assistant den leader, and the denner. The den chief is already what every Cub Scout and Webelos Scout would like to be - a Boy Scout. As far as the younger boys are concerned, he is the person they would most like to follow, and that makes him a natural leader for them

This one day training experience is intended for those Boy Scouts who would like to serve in a leadership position while giving service to brother Cub Scouts. Elements of this training include:
