

We are very pleased to bring to you the Nevada Area Council University of Scouting, **Saturday, October 20th!** Many great classes are being offered. This year Cub Scouting classes will be offered through the Cub Scout Pow Wow, so if you are interested in Cub Scout leader specific training, BALOO, Webelos Outdoor, or supplemental Cub Scout training check out the Pow Wow Flier. Pow Wow is offered on the same date and location.

*American Red Cross CPR is being offered. The fee for this course is \$50 for first time and \$35 for a renewal (This is a \$20 discount). You must hold a current American Red Cross Card to be eligible for the renewal fee. This class is separate and additional fee, i.e. not included in the \$25 fee for University of Scouting. If registering for this class, please register no later than October 2.

Leaders and Parents from all Scouting programs (Except Cub Scouting):

Boy Scouting, Varsity Scouting, Venturing, Unit Commissioners, Roundtable Commissioners and staff, Key 3, District Committee members, and all interested parents and volunteers have classes to attend. This is a once a year opportunity to inject your Scout group with fresh enthusiasm and creative new ideas!

Cost

\$25.00 per participant. * Registration closes October 9th with *no late or on-site registration*. Fee includes program materials, lunch and the neckerchief and degree patches. Sorry, there is no prorated amount for taking only one class. \$7.00 per child for Child Care (3 to11 year old children only, *no exceptions*. Disruptive children will be dismissed from the program), includes lunch and supplies.

All Audiences - College of General Scouting

A100 Youth Protection Training Mandatory training for new leaders about keeping our youth safe. Continuing leaders must renew every 2 years 1 credit. Available at 9am, 10am, 11am, 1pm, 2pm, and 3pm.

A114 Flag Etiquette Stars and Stripe forever! Proper flag etiquette at its best. How to treat Old Glory and give her the proper respect that she deserves. 1 credit. Available at 1pm.

A116 Native American Lore Learn about the customs & traditions of the original people of our area. Ensure that respect is always given and proper research is conducted.

1 credit. Available at 2pm.

A117 Knots & Ropes Learn how to teach basic knots to your Cub & Boy Scouts. Use knot tying as part of your program.

1 credit. Available at 10am.

A121 Native American Crafts

Learn how to make realistic Native American crafts and learn about the origins and meanings. 1 credit. Available at 11am.

A127 Storytelling How do YOU tell a story? Stories can have a great impact on your Scouts. Use them at campfires, use them to teach a moral, use them to entertain. 1 credit. Available at 3pm.

D74 Leave no Trace

Learn about the principles of Leave no Trace and the different awards available at different levels. Protect the environment for Scouting's future. 1 credit. Available at 9am.

American Red Cross CPR

A111 American Red Cross CPR Full CPR certification offered by the American Red Cross. This class is an additional \$50 fee on top of the cost of the University of Scouting. You may renew if you hold a current American Red Cross CPR card for \$35. 1 credit. 3 hour class available at 9am.
