We are proud to announce the new training recognition program that rewards participation in the University of Scouting, district training classes, council training classes, and regional & national training opportunities. The following list is a FULL list of classes planned into the future. Not all classes will be available at the University of Scouting. Some are available through your district, the region, or even national.

Requirements for the non-accredited degrees and certificates in the *College of Cub Scouting*, *College of Boy Scouting*, or *College of Venturing* are as follows: (The College of Commissioner Science has nationally established guidelines, see below.)

ASSOCIATES DEGREE (The Scarf with the main design)

Prerequisite: None

Requirements: Awarded to all non-degreed students upon completion of four (4) class sessions of training (either as a student and/or instructor). These 4 classes include:

1. This is Scouting
2. Any Leader Specific Training (Minimum 3 hours)
3. Youth Protection Training (Online at www.scouter.org)
4. Hazardous Weather Training (Online at www.scouter.org)
5. Safe Swim Defense and/or Safety Afloat (Online at www.scouter.org)

Performance: 1. Approval of district training chair, college dean, or district executive.

BACHELORS DEGREE *first year* (The Scarf with "Bachelor" affixed)

Prerequisite: Completion of the Associates.

Requirements: Awarded upon completion of six (6) class sessions of training not spanning more than two (2) consecutive years (either as a student and/or instructor). Two (2) class sessions must be from the College of General Scouting.

Performance: 1. Approval of district training chair, college dean, or district executive.

MASTERS DEGREE *second year* (The Scarf with "Bachelor & "Masters" affixed)

Prerequisite: Completion of the Bachelors.

Requirements: Awarded upon completion of six (6) class sessions after obtaining a Bachelors Degree (a total of 12 classes), not spanning more than two (2) consecutive years (either as a student and/or instructor). Two (2) class sessions must be from the College of General Scouting.

Performance: 1. Approval of district training chair, college dean, or district executive.

DOCTORATE DEGREE *third & fourth years* (The Scarf with "Bachelor, Masters, & Doctorate affixed)

Prerequisite: Completion of the Masters.

Requirements: Awarded upon completion of at least six (6) class sessions after obtaining a Masters Degree (either as a student and/or instructor). Other requirements include the completion of the Doctoral Project.

Doctoral Project

The Doctoral Project will be in the form of a written report with appropriate photographs (if necessary), reference materials, etc. The subject matter will be of the candidates choosing with guidance and direction from the candidates Counselor. The Counselor will be selected with the mutual approval of the candidate and the proposed counselor. The report will be prepared and submitted via your Counselor for approval from the Council Vice President of Program, or Council Training Chairperson, or Council Commissioner.

Starting with the first projects after approved and completed, the complete project will be published on www.scouter.org.
