History of Wood Badge:

Baden-Powell took the first steps in training Scouting's adult leaders by organizing a series of lectures for Scouters. He made great strides in the following years, culminating in 1919 with the establishment of Wood Badge training. Wood Badge recipients now number more than 100,000 and can be found in all corners of the world.



Wooden Beads:

Upon successful completion of the course, the participants received a parchment certificate and the Wood Badge- two wooden beads worn on a leather thong around the neck. These beads replicate the beads found by Baden Powell during a campaign against the Zulus in 1888. The beads belonged to Dimizulu, an African chieftan. Baden Powell remembered the beads and decided to present a bead to each participant. Because of the beads, the course was called "Wood Badge".



Maclaren Tartan:

In 1919, William de Bois Maclaren, a Scottish businessman, purchased Gilwell Park, a 55-acre estate on the edge of Epping Forest, London, as a training center for Scouters and as a campsite for Scouts. In his honour, the Gilwell staff wore a scarf made of Maclaren tartan.



Turk's Head Woggle:

The woggle was first created in the early 1920s by Bill Shankley, a member of the Gilwell staff. He produced a two-strand Turk's head slide which was adopted as the official woggle.



Ax and Log:

The ax and log is the totem of Gillwell Park.
